Slopes

It is impossible to remember every position for slopes, but try to remember a few below:

Uphill Lie - Narrower stance, ball position to higher foot and shoulders parallel to slope.

Downhill Lie - Wider stance, ball position to higher foot and shoulders parallel to slope.

Ball below Feet - Excessive knee bend, ball position in centre normal grip.

Ball above Feet - Spine angle to slope, ball in centre, grip slightly lower down the club.

Good luck when you try them!

Report

Water

Although last winter was exceptionally wet a very hot summer is forecast. The boreholes which supply water to Pinheiros Altos are giving cause for concern as one of them has become saline and the others are not as full as would normally be expected at this time of year. During the peak months of July and August the golf course needs maximum water to keep it in first class condition and occupancy of the Resort is high. In these circumstances, owners are requested to help by careful use of water and irrigating gardens only at night, when demand from the boreholes is at its lowest.

Longer term, the intention is to transfer the responsibility for water supply to Infraquinta. However, this will involve substantial engineering works which may take a considerable time.

Speed Bumps

At the Annual General Meeting on 6th April 2010 (minutes of which were sent to APPA Members on 19th April) a discussion took place about speed bumps.

Following advice from Infraquinta, the Board decided to proceed with the installation of speed bumps. The most suitable type of bump and the positions of the bumps were subsequently agreed. Infraquinta has been instructed to install them.

Road Names

Pinheiros Altos have chosen road names and the type of road sign has been agreed by Susan Russell and Dirk Blaesing on behalf of the APPA Board. Infraquinta has therefore been requested to proceed.

Security

There have been no security incidents since the Annual General Meeting.

This will involve a visit to the Ilha Deserta, a desert island near Faro, on which the only building is a restaurant called Estamine. We hope that owners and their guests will take part in the Event, which will provide an opportunity to learn about the Ria Formosa and its wildlife and to enjoy a special lunch together.
