Then you have, for those of you who can remember him, Nick Price who had a very fast tempo to his golf swing which was undoubtedly reflective of his pace of life of the off the course. Most players play their best golf when their pace on the course is an extension of their pace of life. Most golfers crack under pressure because their pace increases destroying their technique.

The older you get the more you appreciate your own pace of life and therefore the most natural pace of your swing.

Use the practise ground to match your speed of swing with your speed of life.
